Celebrity designer [Martyn Lawrence Bullard](#) is responsible for the interiors of the model residence and the common spaces within the building. His inspiration for furniture comes from designers of the 1950s and 1960s. They added a level of sophistication that compliments the building's luxury mid-century look. Bullard mixes the modern California lifestyle with inspiration from Brazil's Rio de Janeiro.

With most residences as large as 2,400 square feet, every residence within the Four Seasons represents Los Angeles's posh lifestyle within its most desired neighborhood. These residences also give integrated appliances by Gaggenau, built-in cabinetry and top-of-the-line gourmet kitchens. The bathrooms feel like an escape as they're designed with premium fixtures and the best materials. It makes you feel like you're in a luxury spa. The main bathrooms have deep soaking tubs, marble vanities and showers lined with glass walls.

Harley Pasternak-designed fitness and wellness center, private training rooms and a HydroMassage recovery room. The residences also feature an outdoor zen space and a pool on the terrace.

What good are the rooms without the professionals to work in them? Residents also will have access to personal training services, yoga instructors, celebrity chefs and professional photographers.

They will have access to a tiled saltwater pool. There's a pool surrounded by chic furniture and private cabanas with mini fans. There's a private IMAX movie theater with a 17-foot screen that accommodates 18 people. For those who seek more relaxation and vibes, there's a lounge with a shared kitchen area, library and valet parking.
